"Are we there yet?" We've all heard it and it can be a little annoying, especially the 10th time. If you think about it, that question is actually a positive. It shows a level of hope and eagerness for the destination or event. When it comes to academics, perhaps the most powerful word that our children can incorporate into their vocabulary is "Yet". Children delight in knowing things, but there are times when not knowing or not getting something becomes a source of discouragement or embarrassment. We know that all children learn. What they learn, how much, and when they learn can vary significantly, but that doesn't change the fact that they all can learn. A Growth Mindset assumes that all will learn, and it is simply a matter of time. Learning is not dependent upon a deadline but rather a readiness to assimilate the information and make sense of it, (regardless of what state and federal requirements may exit).

The word "yet" applied to learning is a statement of belief in the eventual ability to gain knowledge. How much more hope is there in the response "I don't know yet" versus "I don't know"? The simple word "Yet" reinforces the idea that they are still working on learning. They will acquire the understanding. When they say, "I don't know" it can be more defeating in that there is no suggestion that they will, in time, know.

If your child is learning something new, whether it's how to tie their shoes, encouraging them to use the word "yet" when describing where they are in their learning, helps to reinforce the idea that they will learn the skill or the information, and that they are still working on it. If they say "I don't know", why not finish their sentence with the word "yet". You don't know how to tie your shoes yet ... you don't know how to read yet ... you don't know what that word means yet, but you will. Using a simple word can help reinforce their understanding that you believe in their ability to grasp the material or learn a skill and trust that the moment will come when they master the information. When they begin to say, "I don't know yet" we will know that they understand that learning something is simply a matter of time and effort and that they will "get it".

FESTIVAL OF LIGHTS

Shared with all our district schools from our Multi Lingual Liasion Coordinator, Nijaza Semic: The happy festival of Diwali (Tihar) is here again. It is the second biggest festival celebrated by Bhutanese Nepalese after Dashain. Diwali, or Deepavali, is the Hindu festival that celebrates the victory of good over evil, knowledge over ignorance. It is celebrated in honour of Lord Ram's return to Ayodhya after an exile of fourteen years. The festival is also linked to Goddess Lakshmi - the Goddess of wealth and prosperity. Also known as the Festival of Lights, Diwali is traditionally celebrated by lighting diyas and candles, praying to Goddess Lakshmi and Lord Ganesh and meeting friends and family to exchange Diwali greetings and gifts. It is considered to be of great importance as it shows reverence to not just the humans and the gods, but also to the animals like crows, cows, and dogs that maintain an intimate relationship with humans. This year, Diwali will be celebrated from October 17 to 21.
