Yesterday, I let our students know about the passing of our crossing guard Reg Robair over the weekend. I realize that only those families that came through the intersection of South Willard and Maple Street knew Reg, I've waved to him as I drove to school since starting at EES seven years ago. After our assembly, I received a video story that was created by a 5th grader in 2006. The student is now in college, but he knew Reg as his crossing guard. His story tells of a near miss with a driver one morning and Reg's quick actions which prevented a tragedy.

The story was that he and his friend were walking to school and needed to cross at South Willard and Maple Street. As usual, Reg walked to the middle of the intersection and held up his stop sign, and then indicated to the boys that it was safe to cross. The boys started crossing when suddenly a motorist, driving fast, drinking coffee and paying attention to papers, drove fast right through the intersection. Reg pushed the boys out of the way of the car. After collecting themselves, and thanking Reg, they ran down to the writer's mother who was by then, yelling at the driver who had stopped. The driver offered to call the police and did. He received a ticket for reckless driving. The boys thanked and hugged Reg again the next morning.

While the moral of the story from the child's perspective was to "be safe" and pay attention, I heard another story. I heard the story of Reg, an individual who protected children and cared enough to put himself between children and imminent danger. What most do not realize, is that our crossing guards are faced with this kind of situation more frequently than they should be. Drivers, stressed and busy with their own lives and thoughts, fail to remember that their immediate needs are not more important than the lives of those crossing the streets.

Our school counselor, Melissa Hathaway, will be offering small group counseling/ support sessions around this loss for students who would like to join. Please let your child's classroom teacher, or Melissa, know if you are interested in having you child participate.
