From the Principal's Desk

When the first days of school were very chilly, I remember thinking that we would be experiencing some hot days before the month was over. We always do. Little did I know that we would be breaking a longstanding record with a heat wave! The school is notoriously hot when it gets like it did this week. It's amazing how well our students and faculty were able to do; continuing to work and learn despite the heat. We are very glad to see the more typical Vermont temperatures return. If anyone questions that the climate is changing, I remember watching my children playing high school soccer games where the snow was flying by the end of September. Granted, I was in the Northeast Kingdom, but this side of the state is only a bit warmer. The change in just 20 years is astonishing and alarming.

We believe in the importance of having our children think about others and our Student Council has organized a fundraising drive with the students for Hurricane Relief. We've all seen in the news how devastated Texas, Florida, Puerto Rico and the US Virgin Islands have been. I have friends living in Miami with family in Puerto Rico who have not been able to confirm that all are ok yet - 9 days after the storm. The stories from those they have heard from are of very tough conditions.

Students are bringing in money in - pennies, nickels, dimes and quarters and some bills here and there. We recognize that our students are giving in proportion to their ability to give and value every cent dropped proudly in the container in the office. If they ask you what they might be able to do to earn some money, or if you would like to help them help be able to give, why not suggest that they could do some chores around the house to earn money to give to the Hurricane Relief. Raking leaves, vacuuming, watching a younger sibling for you while you do a task, are all ideas of tasks they can do to earn money.

Having them earn the money to give rather than just giving them money is healthier and more meaningful. When we give, it involves some level of sacrifice; a decision to not have that cup of coffee, or not buy that pair of shoes because someone else needs something more. If we give children money to give, and it involves no effort on their part, they are not
