From the Principal's Desk

Baby, it's cold outside! While it's true that the students get pretty warm climbing up the sledding hill over and over again, they still need to come to school dressed for the cold. We stay outside until the wind chill hits 0. Today it was 1° and we were outside. I was right out there with them and honestly, with the right clothes, it was fine. The sun was shining, and the fresh air felt great.

Children are coming to our spare clothing area expecting that we can supply them with snow pants, gloves and boots. We have some spares, but we are not in the position to have sufficient supplies for every student who forgets their clothing at home or in the car. A natural consequence is to miss sledding with their friends because we don't let students go sledding if they don't have appropriate clothing. They get too wet. That said, children are forgetful, and need to have help checking their "equipment" before leaving the house or the car.

The best rule of thumb is to assume we will go outside. The students need the fresh air and the exercise. They need to be wearing boots, snow pants, a heavy parka, a hat, and good snow mittens or gloves. Mittens are always warmer. There are places where these are very affordable - Walmart, J.C. Penny's and Kohls all have winter mittens for under \$15 (there are mittens for \$9 at Penny's right now). We found that Costco has snow pants for under \$20. Outdoor Gear Exchange has a used clothing area in the basement that you could also check out. You might want to get an indelible marker to put your child's name in or on the clothing. There are so many pairs of black snow pants that marking them would be really helpful!

Everyone needs boots and everyone needs to know how to keep them warm. Rule number one is that the boots need to be dry on the inside. Boots frequently get wet from sweaty feet, snow and condensation created by warm feet and cold temperatures on the outside of the boot. The liners of the boots get very wet, yet they look fine from the outside. If the liners can be pulled out, that makes drying faster buy simply putting them upside down over a heater all night should dry them out. Please teach your children how to dry their boots in the evening and to make sure that all their winter clothing is hanging up to dry. That way, their clothes are ready to keep them warm the next day.
