As Secretary, I recognize the importance of a school culture and climate that contributes to continuous school effectiveness. Your implementation of this multi-tiered system of supports for behavior is an important action toward success for all learners. I thank and congratulate you and your school community for your focused implementation efforts.

In order to achieve the "VTPBIS Exemplar School" status, your school has:

- Implemented Universal PBIS with fidelity, measured as at least 70% on the Tiered Fidelity Inventory and sustained this measurement for 2 consecutive years;
- Used behavior data within a problem-solving framework to improve student outcomes;
- · Completed the annual Self-Assessment Survey to inform implementation planning; and
- Demonstrated evidence that sustained implementation has had positive effects on learners' academic and behavioral performance.

Your school was recognized during the Annual Vermont PBIS Leadership Forum on October 9th and highlighted in the 2016-17 VTPBIS Annual Report which can be found on the VTPBIS website at <u>www.pbisvermont.org</u>.
