It's that time of year again! Friday, February 9th, our Edmunds Campus community will be heading to UVM to watch the UVM Women's Hockey team play UCONN. Students are free and adults are \$2. This will be the seventh year students from the Edmunds Campus will be in attendance and we are hoping to help the UVM Women's team beat the ECAC record for attendance at a women's game. It will be the first year that musicians from EMS join the UVM Band at the game! The Women's Hockey Team is using Pack the Gutt as a fundraiser for Meals on Wheels. Attendance at the women's games is typically around 300. The largest crowd so far for Pack the Gutt is around 2,100 which was a conference record. We'd like to see the women experience a full house with 4,000 fans. Edmunds families can make a big dent in that number.

If you are new to our community, you may wonder why we go to a UVM Women's Hockey Game. People ask me "Why a women's game?" "Why don't we go to a UVM Men's Game?" The fact that people ask those questions is exactly why I started the partnership with the UVM Women's Team seven years ago. I was so disappointed and frankly upset by the difference in support shown the women's teams versus the men's teams that I wanted to increase the support by bringing a crowd to at least one game. I wanted to help dispel the myth that men's games are better than women's games. They are not better - they are different.

The truth is, the implicit bias that men's sports are better than women's sports is the same kind of implicit bias that we still find in the makeup of Cabinets, board rooms, and management positions. It is an unconscious bias that researchers discovered in the way girls were treated in math classes vs boys. The reality is, that our implicit bias, those deep-seeded assumptions that go unquestioned, need to be questioned. That we have not seen or experienced something does not mean it can or should not exist. It means we need to open our thinking and our experiences.

Perceptions about capabilities of men and women are formed early and through multiple means. If the only teams we ever watch are men's teams, our children get a message that men's athletics are superior to women's. We adults, as role models, perpetuate these stereotypes if we do not seek out that which challenges them. How do those messages extend to other areas of society; to employment, wages, education, and positions of power? The fact is, that women work and play hard; we are skillful and smart, and our games are exciting and few are watching. The women play for the love of the game and the desire to excel. Their grit and determination is admirable.
