This week, we saw the activism of students across the nation concerning the importance of school safety to them in the Walk Out on Wednesday, March 14. Burlington students participated including about 23 EES students, who walked out for 17 minutes. Some people feel that children shouldn't have a say, or be listened to. Who has a greater right to be listened to? I'd like to point out that children are legally required to attend school. School should be made as safe as possible. You as parents and guardians also have a right to expect that your children are safe in school. Faculty and staff also have a right to be safe. We felt it important that the children lead the initiative on the 14th. If you are inclined to speak out about school safety, there is a march in Montpelier this Saturday from 12 to 2 in support of the March for our Lives initiated by the Parkland, Florida high school students.

We do all that we are able at EES to keep our school as safe as possible. As you know, we have a buzzer system and a sign in. We are tightening procedures even more and ask for everyone's understanding and cooperation. The first thing we ask is that everyone follow the procedure of signing in and getting a visitors pass. Everyone who comes to EES will be asked to let us know who you have come to see. We may ask the person you come to see come to escort you to the meeting or classroom that you've come to see. If you are unknown to our door monitor, they will check our student information system to insure that your name is on the list of approved individuals to pick up your child and you will be asked for an ID to verify that you are who you say you are.

School personnel are required to ask those who do not have a visitor's pass who they are in school to see and to go back to the office to sign in and get a visitor's tag. They are also required to alert the office if they have had to do this and give a description of the person to the office so that we can use our security cameras to verify that the person has followed the instructions they were given. All individuals in the building should be wearing an ID or a visitors tag.

There are those who try to skip the process to save time by entering quickly behind someone who was buzzed in after following the procedures (coasting). It can be difficult for the door monitor to manage people signing in while watching for those coasting. If you are aware of someone coasting in behind you, please help us by taking the initiative to say "Safety is important to all of us. Please go back and follow the procedure to sign in". If you are aware that an individual has ignored requests to sign in, and is in the building, please alert the office so that we can address the problem. I know that you may feel that it is somehow not your responsibility to speak to an individual who is coasting in but our school's safety needs to be everyone's concern. Simply assume they don't know the

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procedure and inform them. I will seek out individuals who I've been alerted to and escort them back to follow the procedure. Finally, if someone enters the building and actively refuses to follow procedure, we will go into a lockdown.

I believe that all of the rights in the Constitution need to be in balance in their application; that one amendment in the Bill of Rights does not supersede all others. A 2nd Amendment right defined too expansively has resulted in denying the First Amendment guaranteeing freedom of speech for approximately 7,000 children since 2012's Sandy Hook shooting. I plan to attend the march on Saturday.


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WINTER FUN!
