This week, the principals, together with the Superintendent and District Directors talked about the National School Walkout Day that was inspired by the students from Parkland, Florida. The following statement is the result of those discussions:

"At Burlington School District, we support this national student movement towards safe and inclusive schools. Our students are engaged in critical thinking to empower student voice. As such, we are working with the principals in each of our schools to ensure that any and all activities undertaken in our District on the 14<sup>th</sup> will be done so in an age-appropriate manner, be student-led, and, above all, happen in a safe manner.

To this end, we have encouraged teachers, support staff, and principals to engage their students in critical thinking around the national demonstration: Why is this happening? What are the next steps? Should young people do more and, if so, what can they do? How do you interact with and respect peers who wish to refrain from protesting? What happens when protests don't happen as planned?

This day is not about staff or parents, and the expectation of the District is that parents and staff will be respectful of each students' decision whether or not to participate. Parents may engage directly with their schools to find out ways they can support student-led voice."

Student initiated action will be supported at Edmunds Elementary and will be voluntary. We have had interest in participating by some 5th grade students. We will provide an opportunity for our older students to discuss the initiative and participation. Those choosing to participate will be supported with supervision as will those who choose not to participate. Parents may join the students with the understanding that the students are taking the lead.

I am not surprised that EES students would express interest in participating in this event. Over the years, our students have taken initiative on many issues, even giving testimony at the State House on various issues about which they've learned and become passionate. I cannot think of a more pertinent issue for students than the safety of their schools.

The fact that students would want to participate in activism is an exercise in free speech, a First Amendment right. Understanding that right, and the responsibility inherent in that right is important to our students' understanding of their responsibility as citizens in a democracy. --Dr. Michelle B. Mathias
