Yesterday, the Mayor and the School Board, with the Superintendent, introduced a Bond to upgrade Burlington High School. If you have not been in Burlington High School, there are three upcoming Open Houses and I would strongly urge you to go and see for yourself why the effort is being put before you as voters. I would also urge you to read the information that is on the BSD website.

I'd also like to share what I observed as a parent and resident in Lyndonville, a Northeast Kingdom town of 4,500 people. Lyndon had five schools, all of which were very old and students of different ages were bussed to the school for their age. My two oldest children actually attended a real one room school house for first and second grade, with one teacher and a para. It took ten years for Lyndon voters to approve the \$7.2 million bond to build the three story structure which accommodated the town's 900 K - 8 students. The structure was built with a vision of future needs and an understanding of educational requirements that simply didn't exist 50 years ago.

I'll never forget the scene on the day of the Open House. Many had not stepped in any of the town's schools since their own graduation. They got to see how their taxes were used and their attitudes towards education changed. There was a sense of pride in their schools and their contribution to the effort to educate the children of the town. Interestingly, Lyndon's population grew by 20% a year for over a decade. The town's growth resulted in slowing the increase in property taxes.

Schools are a visible statement about a town's commitment to education. As a former realtor, one of the first question asked when people are looking to establish a business or purchase a house is, "How are the schools?" Take the time to <u>study the issue</u> being presented before you in November. Go to one of the Open Houses so that you can truly understand the importance of this bond.
