You have probably heard the term Restorative Practice spoken and possibly your children are talking about the circles they have in their classroom. Yesterday, the Burlington School District In-Service training was organized in such a way to provide training to over 500 employees, in different locations, and based upon the training they had received to date. It was a pretty complicated endeavor, involving three campuses and a large cadre of trainers dispersed throughout the district.

I am very excited about the inclusion of Restorative Practices in our school as a means to continue to improve our school climate. Restorative Practices is focused on building the community through building relationships by actually learning more about each other. We have done so much work over the years, including new, research based practices and actively teaching students the social and emotional skills needed to be successful. Research has evidence that building better relationships within schools results in better outcomes, both behavioral and academic. The Restorative Practice circles provide an opportunity for each individual to speak or not speak as they choose. There are so many people who may not speak up readily, or raise their hands in order to share their thoughts. The Restorative Practice circle gives an opportunity to each individual to speak if they so choose. Perhaps as important, is the need for each individual to listen when others are speaking. When we consider our current climate, especially what children are seeing on the news in terms of politicians, it is readily apparent that teaching them how to listen is very important.

Starting in January, I will be scheduling some Restorative Practice Circles and posting the times in the Friday Flash and on our website for parents to attend. I have noticed that there are a number of parents who arrive early to pick up their children and wait outside. This would be a perfect time for you to be able to experience what your children experience and to learn more about Restorative Practice Circles. We will finish in time for dismissal so it won't delay you and will provide an opportunity to also get to know more about the other parents who share this community with you. I will also be working with Burlington Kids to run some Restorative Practice Circles for parents that they can
