Social media has proven to present many challenges to parents and students alike and we've recently learned of a "game" that is being circulated through social media and being talked about by children. It is called the "MOMO Challenge". It is being discussed on YouTube, Facebook and WhatsAPP. While the Apps are working to eliminate the challenges when they appear, the stories continue and it was easy enough to find disturbing and threatening videos on YouTube.

The MOMO Challenge is alleged to target young children with a scary character who challenges the viewer to do dangerous things that could cause serious harm. According to a recent (Feb. 28) <u>CBS</u> article "schools in the UK were reporting that some nasty challenges (Momo Challenge) are hacking into children's accounts. The challenges appear midway through Kids YouTube, Fortnight, Peppa pig to avoid detection by adults.

"Law enforcement also says parents need to focus on the bigger picture: "Even basic open source research suggests that 'Momo' is run by hackers who are looking for personal info," <u>PSNI Craigavon</u> wrote on Facebook. "The danger lies with your child feeling pressured to either follow the orders of ANY app via 'challenges,' or peer pressure in chat rooms and the like ... More important is that your child knows not to give out personal info to ANYONE they don't know, that no one has the right to tell them to, or make them do ANYTHING they don't want to."

Social media has a lot of positives, but there are also a lot of negatives and we need to remember that children lack the maturity and wisdom to be able to filter through the information to discern what is real, and what is fake. We see far too many adults willing to re-post fake stories on their Facebook or Twitter pages. If adults don't take the time to figure out if what they are seeing is real, we shouldn't expect children to.

Please monitor your children's on-line activity. You don't need to necessarily stand over their shoulder watching them. You can monitor the history of their internet use and they should know that you will for their own safety, and you know how to do it. To monitor their history, go to the top of your screen where you see:

File-Edit-View-History....etc. Simply click on History and you will see the type of content that they were looking at by simply clicking on each site

on the list. You can also look at the sites being saved or "bookmarked" by going to Bookmarks. You can clear the bookmarks for sites you do not want revisited and the history (which won't prevent the site being revisited, but would require a new search to find it). Most importantly, discuss any sites you find objectionable with your child.
