I hope that all will enjoy a lovely break. I know that this is a very busy time for all of our students and they will benefit from the time off as will the faculty and staff.

As our students face the annual TIDE testing, we have some exciting things happening to help balance their days. Students in every classroom, Kindergarten through 5th grade had the opportunity to experience an energy-related, hands-on learning workshop. The VEEP educators worked with individual teachers and ran the workshops using energy-related science and engineering kits developed by VEEP. VEEP's programming is aligned with the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS), which have been adopted by the Vermont Agency of Education to guide science learning in K-12 classrooms in Vermont. VEEP helps teachers learn about and meet the three dimensions of the NGSS. Students learned about the impact of wind and solar power generation, utilizing simple simulations which included measurements of voltage generated.

When the students return, they will be experiencing a Circus Smirkus Artist in Residence. The goal of Circus Smirkus is to encourage and empower students to set and achieve goals of excellence at their individual level. Circus is a noncompetitive physical art form that focuses on dedication, discipline, and hard work. Accommodations are made so that all students are able to participate. Students will be working on both a variety of movement skills, movement patterns and concepts, such as body awareness, space concepts, qualities of movements, both locomotor and non-locomotor skills, dance and rhythmic activities.

The Circus Smirkus residency will culminate with a performance by the 4th and 5th graders on the afternoon of Friday, May 10 which families will be welcome to attend along with the rest of the student body.

PERSONAL SAFETY LESSONS

Returning from April vacation our School Counselor, Melissa Hathaway and School Counseling Intern, Kate Turpen, will begin teaching classes about personal safety. These lessons have been adapted from the research based programs, Care For Kids (K-2) and We Care Elementary (3-5). The experiential and interactive lessons focus on helping children develop healthy communication skills, and understand boundaries and identify trusted adults in their support system. Additionally, Care For Kids teaches students the anatomically correct names for the private parts of their bodies (penis, vagina, buttocks), as this has been shown to increase communication skills and serve as a protective factor.
