It seems like the blink of an eye when you brought your children to school for the first day in August and here we are ready to send them off for summer vacation. Each year, we watch the growth in the children and there is no better indication of how they are growing than what we see at the end of the year celebration by our Kindergarteners. Yesterday afternoon, our 51 children confidently sang their hearts out for their families, proudly showing what

they had learned. It was adorable, sweet, and

heartwarming.

I know that the state measures progress in metrics called proficiency scores, but the most important metric is in growth. Children of the same age will arrive knowing very different things depending on the opportunities they've had. Some did not count to 10, while others counted to 100; some arrived not knowing any letters or their sounds, while others were beginning to read. The state provides targets of levels for each grade and while that may be what a target to aim for, we look at where the child started, and then what they are able to do now. This allows us to truly understand the work that has been accomplished by the student and their teachers over the course of the year. When we see the growth of our children, we can see remarkable results as some have made gains of 2 -3 years worth of knowledge in one year, rapidly catching up to their peers because they have had the opportunity to learn. These are the results that are truly exciting to see, regardless of whether a score is determined "proficient".

I hope that your child spends some time reading every day this summer. The Fletcher Free Library has a great summer reading program. I hope they play outdoors, and play games that involve math. A simple deck of cards can provide hours of fun and loads of math strategy! I hope that you all have a lovely summer and we look forward to seeing you on Tuesday afternoon August 27th for the Ice Cream Social and Wednesday, August 28th for the first day of school.
