From the Principal's Desk

I know that it is always a bit inconvenient when students are home during the week while the faculty spends the day working at school. I know the students appreciate the day off, and hopefully anyone who got to spend the day with them did too.

The time we spend working together is really valuable, and we don't get much of it. The work that we were doing this Friday is needed to insure that our approaches are coordinated and comprehensive and address the goals that we have submitted to the state which concern math and climate. We have recognized that language and vocabulary are significant to having a solid understanding of math concepts. Our math goal is to increase proficiency through ensuring that students have a solid understanding of the language of math and math vocabulary.

Math instruction and assessments are heavily language based and there are many ways to express the same ideas. Our students need to recognize exactly what is being asked of them when presented with a problem. This means they need to be comfortable with the language of math and proficient in using it so that they are able to identify exactly what they need to do when presented with a problem. Problems are no longer straight equations, but rather situations requiring the student to recognize a number of steps that need to occur prior to actually being able to accurately answer a question

Our Climate Goal is to increase all students' sense of social and emotional safety. We have incorporated Restorative Practice into our daily work and will be working to make sure that all students have trusted adults among the faculty and staff. We will be taking specific, detailed steps to make sure that we can identify those relationships for each and every student. We do this to insure that children know that they matter to us, so that they will feel more willing to invest in themselves here at school.
