

## From the Principal's Desk

After serious consideration, the faculty at EES has decided that in recognition of BSD's standard, that "All Are Welcome", we will be having a Harvest Celebration at the end of the month in which all can participate. We will no longer be having a Halloween Parade.

I know that this will be disappointing to some of our students, but there are enough students who are marginalized for any number of reasons that it isn't appropriate to continue a tradition that has an effect of dividing students.

Edmunds will continue to teach students safe Halloween trick or treat practices, because it is important to reinforce safe practices while trick or treating. Additionally, we will be sharing how to be respectful when selecting a costume for Trick or Treating. We hope to help our children develop the skill to recognize what is culturally respectful. This means costumes that are not demeaning to any person or group based on age, disability, ethnicity, gender, gender identity, nationality, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation, or to any individual staff or student at the school. Costumes should be respectful and culturally sensitive, (e.g., students should not wear religious articles such as a hijab, turban, yarmulke, kimono, which could be viewed as culturally insensitive or as contributing to cultural appropriation). We encourage students to consider making their own costumes from things around the house. Options for costumes include book characters, objects, buildings or historical figures.

We still have some costumes for students who don't have them and would want to trick or treat in the evening. Anyone who would like to bring in an outgrown costume can do so and we'll make sure than any child needing a costume for the evening can take one as long as supplies last.

We will be looking at how to celebrate the Harvest season within each classroom so please check your child's classroom newsletter for an update on that activity.


