We are delighted to be able to share with you that Betsy Nolan is a recipient of the UVM 2019 Outstanding Teacher Award. The contributions that Ms. Nolan makes to our school community are many.

Ms. Nolan's music lessons are always engaging which, given the age span of her students - 5 years old to 11, is not as easy as some may think. Her lessons include not only singing, but learning to read rhythms, and music, dance and playing instruments - percussion, string with the ukulele and recorder. Her students begin to learn the structure of music and experiment with creating their own compositions. Compositions by EES students have been included in the Opus program where the students work with musicians from the VSO and this year, UVM in fine tuning their compositions, ultimately having them performed by professionals. We have had compositions from students as young as 8 selected for inclusion in the Opus program

Betsy has a strong sense of cultural competency, the importance of equity and diversity and is a leader in the EES community in leading the way on these issues. An example is in her advocacy for Chorus to be held during the school day so that all students who wanted to, could participate. She convinced the faculty to sacrifice 45 minutes of academic time once a week so that more students could participate. The results are obvious today as our chorus is both large and highly representative of the diversity of our school.

Ms. Nolan makes her music room and herself available to students. She frequently eats with the students in the cafeteria, building relationships with students throughout the year. She regularly opens her classroom during lunch and recess so that students can work on their compositions, or other projects such as learning the recorder, the ukulele or perfecting a dance routine. Ms. Nolan volunteered to help students organize a Variety Show, providing guidance and structure while making it clear that the students were the workers in the endeavor, requiring that they run the auditions, promote the event, and MC it. The result was a delightful evening for all. She also worked with a group of 5th grade girls who wanted to perform a dance to a Beyonce song which was about power. Her.
