I was listening to NPR over the holiday and there was a long segment, which I think was during the Ted Radio hour, discussing the impact of social media. One particular statement really struck me which I felt well worth sharing "If you don't teach your children to be alone, you teach them to be lonely."

That's a pretty strong statement and yet, we all live in an age where there is an expectation of constant input whether from TV, iPads, or cell phones. Technology has become a playmate to very young children, and at times, a means to entertain and distract.

Media at large and social media in particular offer the option of never being alone with our thoughts. For many, silent reflection or observation is more likely the occasion of lost cable or WiFi signal rather than a matter of choice. An inability to connect through the various platforms can result in significant discomfort and distress. Research has shown an increase in depression among teens corresponding to the growth in the availability of social media and especially among those spending 3 or more hours a day on.

It would be far easier with elementary age students to help them become comfortable

entertaining themselves. Who doesn't remember complaining to a parent that you were bored, and hear the retort - "Go outside and play" or "go read a book", or something to that effect. The impulse to solve the problem of a child's boredom is one that we should all avoid. Learning to entertain oneself is important and teaches children to use their own imagination and to think more deeply. These are important skills for a healthy individual to have. The TV doesn't have to be on, tablets do not have to be available and cell phones isn't necessary. Children do not have to be entertained 100% of the time. In fact, it's better that they are not. The next time your child says they are bored, (perhaps during the December break), you will know that you are being a great parent when you tell them to "go use your imagination."


