April 19 - 23: Spring Break - No School


Increase of In-Person Learning

Dear Edmunds Elementary Families:

This is a reminder that all Vermont students are required to participate in state assessments as part of the accountability system for the "Every Student Succeeds Act" (ESSA).

State Math and English/Language Arts Assessment: All students in grades 3-8 and grade 9 are required each spring to take the state test called the **Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC)**. SBAC is a computer-adaptive assessment, measuring each student's performance against the Common Core State Standards in Mathematics and English/Language Arts. Schools administer SBAC between March and June. Individual results, in the form of parent reports, will be available in the fall.

State Science Assessment: Students in grades 5, 8 and 11 will take the state science assessment. Like SBAC, the science assessment will be administered on a computer and is designed to measure each student's performance against the Next Generation Science Standards (NGSS).
