As you know, Derek Chauvin, the police officer who murdered George Floyd, was found guilty. This is unusual because, in many cases, police are not convicted of murder after killing people. Of approximately 15,000 killings of civilians by police, there have only been seven other convictions.

The guilty decision made all the media. Since we weren't at school, we knew that our students might have an increased awareness of the national event. Given the potential impact on our students of color, as well as their friends and allies, I asked teachers to spend some time this past week providing space to address student questions. While I know some folks may think our students are too young to discuss issues of race, the research is clear students are aware of race issues. As educators we must do our part to support all our students.
