Health & Safety

Properly fitting masks/facial coverings (covering noses, mouths, and chin) are required for **ALL** inside the main building, including main offices. Wearing masks is a condition of attendance and students will not be permitted to attend BSD schools without complying with this safety precaution. As with last year, gaiters and bandanas are not allowed. (Athletic gaiters issued by BSD are allowed for after-school athletic use only, not during the school day.) Masks with one-way valves or vents do not prevent



the person wearing the mask from transmitting COVID-19 to others; these are not allowed and should not be worn by students or staff. Masks are not required outdoors.

Bicycles, Skateboards, Scooters, Roller Blades

Edmunds Elementary encourages students to ride their bicycles, scooters, or skateboards to school when distance and weather permits. However, we cannot be responsible for theft or vandalism. To insure the safety of all children, students are required to walk their bikes, scooters, or skateboards while on school property. **Students must wear a helmet if using a bike, scooter, or skateboard to get to or from school.**

Pediatric Vaccine Clinic



The State of Vermont approved a COVID19 Vaccine for children ages 5-11. The Burlington School District has worked with the Department of Health to allow our school to host school-based vaccination clinics. Our designated day at EES is Wednesday, November 17th from 11:00 am to 5:00 pm. To attend one of these clinics, families should schedule an <u>appointment online</u>. If you have trouble signing up online, you can also try to make an appointment by calling 855-722-7878.

Finally, we want to let you know that within 24 hours of our school clinics being available, we learned that many spots were already full. If this is the case, you still have options! Please remember,

Your child can get a vaccine at ANY available school site that has open spots (you do not have to go to the clinic at your school, or even in your District or county). You may also arrange for your children to be vaccinated at a local pharmacy or check with your child's pediatrician's office.
