
EES Principal Search Forums

We are excited to announce that on Tuesday, May 3rd, we will host the finalists for the EES principal position. All candidates, who will be announced on Monday, May 2nd, will participate in three separate, structured conversations on the following day, May 3rd.

Student Forum: A representative group of 3rd, 4th and 5th grade students will have the opportunity to interview EES Principal candidates on Tuesday, May 3rd.

Staff Forums: (3:30-5:30 p.m.) - The entire staff of EES is invited to attend as the candidates respond to a set of questions developed by the Search Committee and pulled from suggestions offered by the community.

Community Forum: (6:30-8:00 p.m.) - Finally, the candidates will end the day with a community forum with the entire EES community again with questions from the Committee and broader community. This forum will be a hybrid model, in-person in the EES library and via Zoom and BSD's YouTube Channel. Childcare will be provided!

Greetings from the School Counselor's Office

Returning from April vacation students at all grade levels will begin a personal safety unit during classroom guidance. Our Burlington elementary schools use the same research based curricula to support the Act 1 state law. One element of this act requires students to have access to sexual abuse prevention education. For more information you can go to https://dcf.vermont.gov/prevention.

Students in grades K-2 will learn how all parts of their bodies are good & special. There will be a small focus on the anatomy with the purpose of teaching the anatomically correct terms so that a child can ask for help if they need it. They will name adults that can ask for help from, both in school and in the community. There is a large focus on asking for help and being able to identify trusted adults.

Students in 4th & 5th grade will talk and learn about healthy relationships with peers and adults. This will be explored through lessons on understanding feelings, reading body language, asking for help and establishing personal boundaries.
