<u> A Message from our Principal – Kolby Snellenberger</u>

School starts this week and we are excited to kick off another great year. One of our most significant daily challenges is the drop-off location at the driveway in front of the elementary. We need your help and cooperation to help us keep things moving and students safe.

- Do not drop off students before 7:45 a.m. as there are no staff to supervise students.
- Please do not leave your car in the drive or try to park in the horseshoe drive. There is some on-street parking near the school if you want to walk your child to the door.

The Buzz

- Staff and volunteers will open doors for students to enter the campus. Kindergarten and first-grade students will go straight to the playground, second and third-grade will go to the East side of the building, and fourth and fifth-grade students will be directed to the field. We will have staff at all locations to supervise students.
- We have two school buses that must move through this area every morning and need room to maneuver through that space. While buses are loading and unloading, it is illegal to pass them.

Afternoon pickup is another very challenging time. There is a lot of traffic at this time of day so please be patient and expect delays.

- If possible, **please do not use the horseshoe driveway**. It is best and often faster to park on the street and walk to the front of the school to pick up your child.
- Do not park in the front horseshoe drive.
- Cars should always turn right from the horseshoe drive to keep traffic moving.

To all of our new Kindergarten families! The first few days of school are exciting, but this can be an anxious time for new families and our kindergarteners. As parents, we want to support our children during this significant transition. Often, it is parents who struggle with this transition more than children. Our anxiety around our children's first day changes what should be an exciting opportunity to take a big step towards independence into an uncertain moment for them. Our children pick up on our emotions, and when we look and act anxious, they internalize our worry and become fearful. The longer this is allowed to continue, the more these negative emotions will build. To help your child have the best start to the day:

- Let them exit the car independently in the drive, and staff will lead them to the playground. In most cases, this will create the smoothest transition for both parents and children. It helps if you explain that you will pull into the driveway and someone will open the door and lead them to where they need to go.
- Park on the street, bring them straight up to the playground and encourage them to play with other children as soon as they arrive. Once they are engaged in playing, say goodbye to them and tell them you can't wait to hear about their first day of school when you pick them up.
- Have an activity for after school that they can look forward to so that you have something fun and exciting to talk about as you are approaching the school.
- Trust that your children are in great hands. We have helped hundreds of students over the years to make this transition.
- The PTO will be providing coffee for parents so that you let your child join the other children and spend a moment socializing with other parents. This is a great opportunity to get to know the parents of children that your child will be forming friendships with.

First 3 days of Kindergarten is 1/2 Days!

For the first 3 days of school, kindergarten students will have a halfday ending at 11:30. Students will be scheduled for individual assessments in the afternoon. Be on the lookout for an email with details about your day and time!

Grades 1-5 Have Full Day, August 30th

A reminder to all our families that students are **dismissed at 1:50 on** Wednesday's during the school year; this allows for professional development of our teachers and staff. Please make every effort to pick your child up on time! Grades 1-5 have a full-day of school on their first day back! 8:10-1:50
