A Message from our Principal -Kolby Snellenberger

One of the things I value the most is the partnership between parents and our school in fostering a positive and productive learning environment for all our students.

Lately, we've noticed a pattern of students being picked up early from school on a regular basis, which can have a significant impact on their academic progress and social development. While we understand that there may be occasional appointments or emergencies that necessitate early dismissals, we are concerned about the chronic nature of these early pick-ups.

Regular attendance is crucial for your child's educational growth. When a student is consistently picked up early, they miss valuable instructional time that can affect their understanding of the curriculum and their ability to keep up with their peers. It can also disrupt the classroom environment and the continuity of their learning.

We encourage you to consider the importance of consistent attendance and the impact of early dismissals on your child's education. To help your child make the most of their learning experience, we kindly request that you limit early pick-ups to essential appointments and emergencies. In cases where early dismissal is necessary, please notify the school in advance so we can ensure a smooth and organized process.


