### Painted Silhouettes

Artists in grade 5 chose a single hue to paint monochromatic backgrounds of moonlight to set the stage for scenes in silhouette. Choosing to work either freehand or to use graphite transfer paper with photographs, students created landscapes in silhouette full of trees, animals, cliffs, cemeteries, castles, and more. The effect of a silhouette occurs when the light source, such as the moon, is behind the subject, causing it to be backlit, with little to no light in front of the subject.











## Keith Haring-inspired Drawings

Several fifth grade students looked at the iconic drawings of the artist Keith Haring, and experimented with wide-width india ink and watercolor markers to make drawings of the own, showing the joy and action for which Haring's work is well-known.





## **Texture Tiles**

Fourth grade artists explored a variety of ways to make both pressed and raised textures in clay. Students used stamps, wood tools, texture plates, strings of beads, and more to create textures. The pieces were colored with oil pastel, then dipped into India ink to heighten the visibility of the textures.
