The Burlington School Board has unanimously approved the <u>calendar for the 2024-2025</u> <u>school year</u>! For the first time, the Champlain Valley Superintendent's Association (CVSA) has developed a regional calendar instead of doing it by county. This will help us align our calendars, better coordinate across the region, and meet the State laws for our technical centers that require us to have 175 common school days across the region.

Through these hands-on teaching tools, students are learning about where food comes from, while also understanding the value of hyper-local, high-quality produce to support a healthy and balanced lifestyle!
