Greetings from the School Counselor's Office

During the month of May our classroom guidance lessons will focus on our personal safety unit. This is an important unit to help meet the requirements of the Act 1 state law. One element of this act requires all students to have access to sexual abuse prevention education annually.

Our K-2 students will focus on personal boundaries and their right to say "no". We will emphasize the importance of asking for help if they feel unsafe or uncomfortable, and the importance of having trusted adults at school, at home and in the community. There will be a small focus on the anatomy with the purpose of teaching the anatomically correct terms of the private parts of their bodies so a child can ask for help from their trusted adults if they need it.

Students in 3rd, 4th & 5th grade will learn about healthy versus unhealthy and unsafe relationships with peers and adults. Similar to our younger grades, this will be explored through lessons on personal boundaries and their right to say "no", as well as the importance of having trusted adults they can always talk to or ask for help from if they are feeling confused or unsafe.

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Dear EES Families:

The 2024 *Hannaford Helps Schools* program has officially launched! And although you may not be aware of it, each year, our school has benefitted from this campaign.

In addition to redeeming School Dollars online, we will continue to have an in-store collection tower. All School Dollar printouts collected this way will be evenly distributed among all participating schools.
