## Greetings from the School Counselor's Office

#### Dear Families,

As we return from April vacation, students at all grade levels will begin a **Personal Safety Unit** during classroom guidance time. This unit is part of the curriculum in all Burlington elementary schools and helps us meet the requirements of **Act 1**, a state law mandating that students receive **sexual abuse prevention education** each year.

Here's what students will be learning:

#### ● Grades K-2:

Students will learn that all parts of their bodies are good and special. There will be a brief focus on anatomy to introduce the anatomically correct names for private body parts. This is important so children can clearly express themselves and ask for help if needed. Lessons will also emphasize the importance of talking to trusted adults when they have questions or concerns about their bodies. Students will identify trusted adults at school, at home, and in the community whom they can go to for support.

#### ■ Grades 3–5:

Students will engage in discussions about healthy relationships. Topics will include personal boundaries, consent, and the importance of identifying trusted adults. The goal is to ensure students feel empowered to seek help if they ever feel uncomfortable or unsafe in any relationship.
